City Council Meeting

REGULAR MEETING MINUTES FOR MONDAY, JANUARY 10TH, 2022 AT 5:30 P.M.

I. Mayor Parker opened the council meeting at 5:30 p.m. and called Roll. Council members present were Brian Dorsett, Tom Flanery, Shane Gliem, Stan Landon, and Curtis Thornberry. Staff attending Joyce Calmer-Deputy City Clerk, Levi Johnson-Paramedic, Doug Long-Electrical Superintendent, and Lisa Grossman-City Administrator. The meeting was accessible electronically thru GoToMeeting as allowed by Section 21.8 of the Iowa Code.

II. Approval of Agenda – Flanery made a motion to approve the agenda, seconded by Landon. Motion carried unanimously.

III. Public Forum – None

IV. Consent Items – Landon moved to approve the minutes of 12-13-21 Regular Meeting, seconded by Thornberry. Motion carried unanimously.

V. Council Business

A. Resolution 22-01 was considered, approving a tax exemption for 120 W Church Street. Thornberry made a motion to approve, seconded by Dorsett. With the roll being called, the resolution carried unanimously.

B. Mayor Parker asked if there was a motion on the second reading of Ordinance 334, amending Chapter 47.06 of Park Regulations, relating to Camping as written. No motion was made. Council member Dorsett requested a change to the wording of the ordinance to allow camping during the months of April-October with no more than 14 consecutive days. Hearing consensus of the Council, Council Member Dorsett introduced the first reading of an ordinance entitled “Ordinance No. 334. An Ordinance amending Chapter 47.06 of Park Regulations, relating to Camping.”

It was moved by Council Member Dorsett and seconded by Council Member Landon that the aforementioned Ordinance be now received, placed on file and read by the City Clerk, the Mayor put the question on the motion and the roll being called, the following named Council Members voted:

Ayes: Dorsett, Flanery, Gliem, Landon, Thornberry

Nays: None

Whereupon, the Mayor declared the motion duly carried and declared that said ordinance had been given its initial consideration.

It was moved by Council Member Thornberry and seconded by Council Member Landon that the statutory rule requiring an ordinance to be considered and voted on for passage at two City Council meetings prior to the meeting at which it is to be finally passed be suspended and the ordinance entitled “Ordinance No. 334. An Ordinance amending Chapter 47.06 of Park Regulations, relating to Camping,” now be put upon its final consideration and adoption. The mayor put the question on the motion and the roll being called, the following named Council Members voted:

Whereupon, the Mayor declared the motion duly carried and the ordinance duly adopted, as follows:

ORDINANCE NO. 334

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CITY CODE OF THE CITY OF PANORA, IOWA, by amending Chapter 47.06 of Park Regulations, relating to Camping.

BE IT ENACTED by the City Council of the City of Panora, Iowa;

SECTION 1. 47.06 CAMPING. No person shall camp in any portion of a park except in areas prescribed or designated by the Council. Camping shall be in compliance with all posted rules which govern the park facility. It is hereby designated that no camping is allowed at Michael Mills Park and only primitive camping shall be allowed at Waterworks Park for the months of April 1st to October 31st for no more than 14 consecutive days or a total of 21 days in any one month. Primitive camping is defined as camping on an unimproved site, without use of services such as, but not limited to running water and electricity.

SECTION 2. REPEALER. All ordinances or parts of ordinances that are in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, provision or part of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision, or part thereof not adjudged as invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 4. WHEN EFFECTIVE. This Ordinance shall be in effect from and after the later to occur of its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

Parker asked for a motion to adjourn. Landon made a motion to adjourn at 6:00 p.m., seconded by Flanery. With the roll being called, the motion carried unanimously.
